The regular meeting of the Department of Parks and Recreation for the Town of St. John, Indiana was held on Monday, September 30, 1974.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the August meeting were read and approved as read.

Mr. Hancock reported that the line that is down in the Park appears to be an unused telephone line, and he did call Illinois Bell, however, to this date nothing has been done. He will call them again.

Mr. Hancock also reported that Michigan Wisconsin Pipeline Company was contacted for a used culvert and they have nothing to offer. Mr. Hancock is to meet with Morrison Construction Company to see if they might have some used culvert.

Mr. Monix has a purchase order for the tile to be installed in the Park, and he hopes to begin work on this project next week. As far as he can determine, the costs will be as followed:

Tile - \$200.00
Stone - \$70.00
Rental of trencher - \$55.00
Total Cost of \$325.00

Mr. Spring reported that he contacted the owners of Bingo Lake, which is for sale and the price is \$210,00.00. The owners are perhaps willing to work out something wherein part of the land would be sold and part of it would be donated, thus enabling us to apply for matching funds. Mr. Spring suggested that we contact the Town Attorney to see exactly how this could be handled.

Reference the bike route, Mr. Hancock thought it very important that no route be established along main thoroughfares such as Route 41 or West 93rd Avenue. Mrs. Pietrzak moved that if Mr. Hancock is willing, he be appointed to take complete charge of the bike route project. Mrs. Jernberg seconded the motion. Mr. Hancock indicated his willingness and the motion was passed.

The Spring Vacation Skating Party was brought up and it was suggested that the Omni Sports Complex be contacted now to reserve the date.

Possible ideas for the Summer Recreation Program were discussed, however the matter was tabled, and no definite plans were made.

ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned until Monday, October 28, 1974 at 7:30 p.m.
