The January 23, 1977 Park Board meeting was attended by President Richard Spring and Quad Town Coordinator Darrell Mueller. Because of the lack of a quorum, no action could be taken. Discussion on the following items on the agenda was as follows:

Mr. Spring asked that a letter be sent to the Lake Central School Corporation, requesting the use of the lights and poles in the front of the High School, which were taken down.

The Quad Town situation was discussed. Meeting with the two remaining towns in the agreement established that they wished to continue with the program. We would have to wait for Schererville's decision as their continued support of the agreement, and if they planned to pay the six-month amount due to St. John, Dyer, and Lowell. A new contract would be drawn up as soon as this information becomes available.

The election of Park Board Officers would be postponed until a quorum of members is present.

Other items on the agenda will be discussed at the next meeting.

The Plan Commission invited Mr. Spring and Mr. Mueller to the Plan Commission meeting, which was being conducted at the same time as our meeting. Because of the Teachers' meeting that night, Mr. Wease, the liaison to the Plan Commission was not in attendance, so Mr. Spring and Mr. Mueller attended the meeting.

Developers for Lancer Estates indicated that two (2) lots would be available for open space in their new development. Any two lots, which the Park Board felt was acceptable, would be set aside. Mr. Spring indicated that the Park Board would have to inspect the site before a decision could be reached. Developers asked that a decision be made by the next Plan Commission meeting, so that plans could be finalized. Mr. Spring was given a site plan to aid the Park Board in their decision.
